

# HOUSE BILL No. 4398

March 19, 2019, Introduced by Reps. Sheppard, Miller, LaFave, Kahle and Bellino and referred to the Committee on Insurance.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code," by amending sections 226, 227a, 323, 328, 518b, 658, 665, 665b, 732, and 801e (MCL 257.226, 257.227a, 257.323, 257.328, 257.518b, 257.658, 257.665, 257.665b, 257.732, and 257.801e), section 226 as amended by 2018 PA 342, section 227a as added by 1995 PA 287, section 323 as amended by 2018 PA 99, section 328 as amended by 2015 PA 135, section 518b as added by 2016 PA 348, section 658 as amended by 2018 PA 204, section 665 as amended by 2016 PA 332, section 665b as added by 2016 PA 333, section 732 as amended by 2017 PA 160, and section 801e as amended by 1983 PA 91.

**THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:**

1           Sec. 226. (1) A vehicle registration issued by the secretary  
2 of state expires on the owner's birthday, unless another expiration

1 date is provided for under this act or unless the registration is  
2 for the following vehicles, in which case registration expires on  
3 the last day of February:

4 (a) A commercial vehicle except for a commercial vehicle  
5 issued a registration under the international registration plan or  
6 a pickup truck or van owned by an individual.

7 (b) Except for a trailer or semitrailer issued a registration  
8 under the international registration plan, a trailer or semitrailer  
9 owned by a business, corporation, or person other than an  
10 individual; or a pole trailer.

11 (2) The expiration date for a registration issued for a  
12 motorcycle is the motorcycle owner's birthday.

13 (3) The expiration date for a registration bearing the letters  
14 "SEN" or "REP" is February 1.

15 (4) In the case of a vehicle owned by a business, corporation,  
16 or an owner other than an individual, the secretary of state may  
17 assign or reassign the expiration date of the registration.

18 (5) The secretary of state shall do all of the following:

19 (a) After the October 1 immediately preceding the year  
20 designated on the registration, issue a registration upon  
21 application and payment of the proper fee for a commercial vehicle,  
22 other than a pickup or van owned by an individual; or a trailer  
23 owned by a business, corporation, or person other than an  
24 individual.

25 (b) Beginning 60 days before the expiration date assigned on  
26 an international registration plan registration plate, issue a  
27 registration under section 801g upon application and payment of the

1 proper apportioned fee for a commercial vehicle engaged in  
2 interstate commerce.

3 (c) Beginning 45 days before the owner's birthday and 120 days  
4 before the expiration date assigned by the secretary of state,  
5 issue a registration for a vehicle other than those designated in  
6 subsection (1)(a) or (b). However, if an owner whose registration  
7 period begins 45 days before his or her birthday will be out of the  
8 state during the 45 days immediately preceding expiration of a  
9 registration or for other good cause shown cannot apply for a  
10 renewal registration within the 45-day period, application for a  
11 renewal registration may be made not more than 6 months before  
12 expiration.

13 (6) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the  
14 secretary of state, upon application and payment of the proper fee,  
15 shall issue a registration for a vehicle or a motorcycle to a  
16 resident that shall expire on the owner's birthday. If the owner's  
17 next birthday is at least 6 months but not more than 12 months in  
18 the future, the owner shall receive a registration valid until the  
19 owner's next birthday. If the owner's next birthday is less than 6  
20 months in the future, the owner shall receive a registration valid  
21 until the owner's birthday following the owner's next birthday. The  
22 tax required under this act for a registration described in this  
23 subsection shall be either of the following:

24 (a) For an original registration, the tax shall bear the same  
25 relationship to the tax required under section 801 for a 12-month  
26 registration as the length of the registration bears to 12 months.

27 (b) For a renewal of a registration, either of the following:

1 (i) For a registration that is for at least 6 months but not  
2 more than 12 months, the same amount as for 12 months.

3 (ii) For a renewal of a registration that is for more than 12  
4 months, 2 times the amount for 12 months.

5 Partial months shall be considered as whole months in the  
6 calculation of the required tax and in the determination of the  
7 length of time between the application for a registration and the  
8 owner's next birthday. The tax required for that registration shall  
9 be rounded off to whole dollars as provided in section 801.

10 (7) A certificate of title shall remain valid until canceled  
11 by the secretary of state for cause or upon a transfer of an  
12 interest shown on the certificate of title.

13 (8) The secretary of state, upon request, shall issue special  
14 registration for commercial vehicles, valid for 6 months after the  
15 date of issue, if the full registration fee exceeds \$50.00, on the  
16 payment of 1/2 the full registration fee and a service charge as  
17 enumerated in section 802(1).

18 (9) The secretary of state may issue a special registration  
19 for each of the following:

20 (a) A new vehicle purchased or leased outside of this state  
21 and delivered in this state to the purchaser or lessee by the  
22 manufacturer of that vehicle for removal to a place outside of this  
23 state, if a certification is made that the vehicle will be  
24 primarily used, stored, and registered outside of this state and  
25 will not be returned to this state by the purchaser or lessee for  
26 use or storage.

27 (b) A vehicle purchased or leased in this state and delivered

1 to the purchaser or lessee by a dealer or by the owner of the  
2 vehicle for removal to a place outside of this state, if a  
3 certification is made that the vehicle will be primarily used,  
4 stored, and registered outside of this state and will not be  
5 returned to this state by the purchaser or lessee for use or  
6 storage.

7 (10) A special registration issued under subsection (9) is  
8 valid for not more than 30 days after the date of issuance, and a  
9 fee shall be collected for each special registration as provided in  
10 section 802(3). The special registration may be in the form  
11 determined by the secretary of state. If a dealer makes a retail  
12 sale or lease of a vehicle to a purchaser or lessee who is  
13 qualified and eligible to obtain a special registration, the dealer  
14 shall apply for the special registration for the purchaser or  
15 lessee. If a person other than a dealer sells or leases a vehicle  
16 to a purchaser or lessee who is qualified and eligible to obtain a  
17 special registration, the purchaser or lessee shall appear in  
18 person, or by a person exercising the purchaser's or lessee's power  
19 of attorney, at an office of the secretary of state and furnish a  
20 certification that the person is the bona fide purchaser or lessee  
21 or that the person has granted the power of attorney, together with  
22 other forms required for the issuance of the special registration  
23 and provide the secretary of state with proof that the vehicle is  
24 covered by a ~~Michigan no-fault~~ **AN** insurance policy issued under  
25 **THAT COMPLIES WITH** section ~~3101~~ **3009** of the insurance code of 1956,  
26 1956 PA 218, MCL 500.3101, ~~or proof that the vehicle is covered by~~  
27 ~~a policy of insurance issued by an insurer under section 3163 of~~

1 ~~the insurance code of 1956, 1956 PA 218, MCL 500.3163.~~ **500.3009.**

2 The certification required ~~in~~ **UNDER** this subsection shall contain  
3 all of the following:

4 (a) The address of the purchaser or lessee.

5 (b) A statement that the vehicle is purchased or leased for  
6 registration outside of this state.

7 (c) A statement that the vehicle shall be primarily used,  
8 stored, and registered outside of this state.

9 (d) The name of the jurisdiction in which the vehicle is to be  
10 registered.

11 (e) Other information requested by the secretary of state.

12 (11) In the case of a commercial vehicle, trailer, or  
13 semitrailer issued a registration under the international  
14 registration plan, the secretary of state in mutual agreement with  
15 the owner may assign or reassign the expiration date of the  
16 registration. However, the expiration date agreed to shall be  
17 either March 31, June 30, September 30, or December 31 or beginning  
18 on February 19, 2019, the last day of a calendar month. Renewals  
19 expiring on or after June 30, 2020 shall be for a minimum of at  
20 least 12 months if there is a change in the established expiration  
21 date.

22 (12) The expiration date for a multiyear registration issued  
23 for a leased vehicle shall be the date the lease expires but shall  
24 not be for a period longer than 24 months.

25 Sec. 227a. (1) If a court has notified the secretary of state  
26 of a vehicle registration number as provided in section 328(4) and  
27 the owner has not secured proof that the vehicle involved in the

1 violation is currently insured under ~~chapter 31~~ **AN INSURANCE POLICY**  
2 **THAT COMPLIES WITH SECTION 3009** of the insurance code of 1956, Act  
3 ~~No. 218 of the Public Acts of 1956, being sections 500.3101 to~~  
4 ~~500.3179 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, 1956 PA 218, MCL 500.3009,~~  
5 the secretary of state shall not renew, replace, or transfer the  
6 registration plate of the vehicle ~~involved in the violation or~~  
7 allow the purchase of a new registration plate for the vehicle  
8 ~~involved in the violation,~~ until the owner or the owner's  
9 representative appears at a branch office and does both of the  
10 following:

11 (a) Shows a certified statement from an automobile insurer on  
12 a standard form prescribed by the ~~commissioner~~ **DIRECTOR** of **THE**  
13 **DEPARTMENT OF** insurance **AND FINANCIAL SERVICES** that the vehicle  
14 ~~involved in the violation~~ is currently insured under a prepaid  
15 ~~noncancelable~~ **INSURANCE** policy **THAT IS NOT CANCELABLE** for a period  
16 of ~~not less than 6 months under chapter 31 of Act No. 218 of the~~  
17 ~~Public Acts of 1956.~~ **OR LONGER AND THAT COMPLIES WITH SECTION 3009**  
18 **OF THE INSURANCE CODE OF 1956, 1956 PA 218, MCL 500.3009.**

19 (b) Pays a fee of \$50.00 in addition to any other fee required  
20 by law, of which \$25.00 shall be allocated to the secretary of  
21 state to defray the costs of administering this section.

22 (2) The secretary of state may cancel the registration of a  
23 motor vehicle under either of the following circumstances:

24 (a) The secretary of state receives notice that a court has  
25 determined that a vehicle involved in the violation was not insured  
26 ~~as required by chapter 31 of Act No. 218 of the Public Acts of~~  
27 ~~1956,~~ **UNDER AN INSURANCE POLICY THAT COMPLIED WITH SECTION 3009 OF**

1 **THE INSURANCE CODE OF 1956, 1956 PA 218, MCL 500.3009**, at the time  
2 of registration.

3 (b) The secretary of state receives notice that a court has  
4 determined that the owner or the owner's representative presented a  
5 certificate of insurance that was forged, altered, fraudulent, or  
6 counterfeit when insurance was required by this act.

7 (3) Before a ~~cancellation occurs~~ **THE SECRETARY OF STATE**  
8 **CANCELS A REGISTRATION** under subsection (2), **THE SECRETARY OF STATE**  
9 **SHALL GIVE** the person who will be affected by the cancellation  
10 ~~shall be given~~ notice and an opportunity to be heard.

11 Sec. 323. (1) A person aggrieved by a final determination of  
12 the secretary of state denying the person an operator's or  
13 chauffeur's license, a vehicle group designation, or an indorsement  
14 on a license or revoking, suspending, or restricting an operator's  
15 or chauffeur's license, vehicle group designation, or an  
16 indorsement may petition for a review of the determination in the  
17 circuit court in the county where the person was arrested if the  
18 denial or suspension was imposed under section 625f or under the  
19 order of a trial court under section 328 or, in all other cases, in  
20 the circuit court in the person's county of residence. The person  
21 shall file the petition within 63 days after the determination is  
22 made except that for good cause shown the court may allow the  
23 person to file petition within 182 days after the determination is  
24 made. As provided in section 625f, a peace officer aggrieved by a  
25 determination of a hearing officer in favor of a person who  
26 requested a hearing under section 625f may, with the prosecuting  
27 attorney's consent, petition for review of the determination in the



1 circuit court in the county where the arrest was made. The peace  
2 officer shall file the petition within 63 days after the  
3 determination is made except that for good cause shown the court  
4 may allow the peace officer to file the petition within 182 days  
5 after the determination is made.

6 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the circuit  
7 court shall enter an order setting the cause for hearing for a day  
8 certain not more than 63 days after the order's date. The order, a  
9 copy of the petition that includes the person's full name, current  
10 address, birth date, and driver's license number, and all  
11 supporting affidavits must be served on the secretary of state's  
12 office in Lansing not less than 20 days before the date set for the  
13 hearing. If the person is seeking a review of the record prepared  
14 under section 322 or section 625f, the service upon the secretary  
15 of state must be made not less than 50 days before the date set for  
16 the hearing.

17 (3) The court may take testimony and examine all the facts and  
18 circumstances relating to the denial, suspension, or restriction of  
19 the person's license under sections 303(1)(d), 320, or 904(10) or  
20 (11), a licensing action under section 310d, or a suspension for a  
21 first violation under section 625f. The court may affirm, modify,  
22 or set aside the restriction, suspension, or denial, except the  
23 court shall not order the secretary of state to issue a restricted  
24 or unrestricted chauffeur's license that would permit the person to  
25 drive a commercial motor vehicle that hauls a hazardous material.  
26 The court shall enter the order and the petitioner shall file a  
27 certified copy of the order with the secretary of state's office in

1 Lansing within 7 days after entry of the order.

2 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this section, in reviewing  
3 a determination resulting in a denial, suspension, restriction, or  
4 revocation under this act, the court shall confine its  
5 consideration to a review of the record prepared under section 322  
6 or 625f or the driving record created under section 204a for a  
7 statutory legal issue, and may determine that the petitioner is  
8 eligible for full driving privileges or, if the petitioner is  
9 subject to a revocation under section 303, may determine that the  
10 petitioner is eligible for restricted driving privileges. The court  
11 shall set aside the secretary of state's determination only if 1 or  
12 more of the following apply:

13 (a) In determining whether a petitioner is eligible for full  
14 driving privileges, the petitioner's substantial rights have been  
15 prejudiced because the determination is any of the following:

16 (i) In violation of the Constitution of the United States, the  
17 state constitution of 1963, or a statute.

18 (ii) In excess of the secretary of state's statutory authority  
19 or jurisdiction.

20 (iii) Made upon unlawful procedure resulting in material  
21 prejudice to the petitioner.

22 (iv) Not supported by competent, material, and substantial  
23 evidence on the whole record.

24 (v) Arbitrary, capricious, or clearly an abuse or unwarranted  
25 exercise of discretion.

26 (vi) Affected by other substantial and material error of law.

27 (b) In determining whether a petitioner is eligible for review

1 of a revocation or denial under section 303, or whether a  
2 petitioner is eligible for restricted driving privileges, all of  
3 the following apply:

4 (i) The petitioner's substantial rights have been prejudiced  
5 as described in subdivision (a).

6 (ii) All of the following are satisfied:

7 (A) The revocation or denial occurred at least 1 year after  
8 the petitioner's license was revoked or denied, or, if the  
9 petitioner's license was previously revoked or denied within the 7  
10 years preceding the most recent revocation or denial, at least 5  
11 years after the most recent revocation or denial, whichever is  
12 later.

13 (B) The court finds that the petitioner meets the department's  
14 requirements under the rules promulgated by the department under  
15 the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201  
16 to ~~24.238.~~ **24.328**. For purposes of this sub-subparagraph only, the  
17 court may take additional testimony to supplement the record  
18 prepared under section 322 or 625f or the driving record created  
19 under section 204a, but shall not expand the record.

20 (C) If the revocation or denial was under section 303(2) (a),  
21 (b), (c), or (g), the petitioner rebuts by clear and convincing  
22 evidence the presumption that he or she is a habitual offender, and  
23 establishes to the court's satisfaction that he or she is likely to  
24 adhere to any requirements imposed by the court. For purposes of  
25 this sub-subparagraph, the conviction that resulted in the  
26 revocation and any record of denial of reinstatement by the  
27 department are prima facie evidence that the petitioner is a

1 habitual offender. For purposes of this sub-subparagraph only, the  
2 court may take additional testimony to supplement the record  
3 prepared under section 322 or 625f or the driving record created  
4 under section 204a, but shall not expand the record.

5 (5) If the court determines that a petitioner is eligible for  
6 restricted driving privileges under subsection (4) (b), the court  
7 shall issue an order that includes, but is not limited to, all of  
8 the following:

9 (a) The court's findings under section 303 and R 257.1 to R  
10 257.1727 of the Michigan Administrative Code.

11 (b) A requirement that each motor vehicle operated by the  
12 petitioner be equipped with a properly installed and functioning  
13 ignition interlock device for a period of not less than 1 year  
14 before the petitioner will be eligible to return to the secretary  
15 of state for a hearing. The petitioner shall bear the cost of an  
16 ignition interlock device required under this subdivision. A  
17 restricted license must not be issued to the petitioner until the  
18 secretary of state has verified that 1 or more ignition interlock  
19 devices, if applicable, have been installed as required by this  
20 subdivision.

21 (c) A method by which the court will verify that the  
22 petitioner maintains ~~no-fault~~ insurance for each vehicle described  
23 in subdivision (b) ~~as required by chapter 31~~ **THAT COMPLIES WITH**  
24 **SECTION 3009** of the insurance code of 1956, 1956 PA 218, MCL  
25 ~~500.3101 to 500.3179.~~ **500.3009.**

26 (d) A requirement that a restricted license issued to the  
27 petitioner must not permit the petitioner to operate a commercial

1 motor vehicle that hauls hazardous materials.

2 (e) A provision that the secretary of state shall revoke the  
3 petitioner's restricted license if any of the following occur:

4 (i) The petitioner violates the restrictions on his or her  
5 license.

6 (ii) The petitioner violates subdivision (b).

7 (iii) The petitioner removes, or causes to be removed, an  
8 ignition interlock device required under subdivision (b), unless  
9 the secretary of state has authorized the removal under section  
10 322a.

11 (iv) The petitioner commits an act that would be a major  
12 violation if the petitioner's license had been issued under section  
13 322(6) or consumes alcohol or a controlled substance without a  
14 prescription. As used in this subparagraph, "major violation" means  
15 that term as defined in R 257.301a of the Michigan Administrative  
16 Code.

17 (v) The petitioner is arrested for a violation of section 625  
18 or a local ordinance, law of this state or another state, or law of  
19 the United States that substantially corresponds to section 625.

20 (6) If the court determines that a petitioner is eligible for  
21 restricted driving privileges under this section and the petitioner  
22 intends to operate a vehicle owned by his or her employer, the  
23 court shall notify the employer of the petitioner's obligation  
24 under subsection (5) (b). This subsection does not require an  
25 employer who receives a notice under this subsection to install an  
26 ignition interlock device on a vehicle. This subsection does not  
27 apply to a vehicle that is operated by a self-employed individual

1 who uses the vehicle for both business and personal use.

2 (7) If a court determines that a petitioner is eligible for  
3 restricted driving privileges, the secretary of state shall not  
4 issue a restricted license to the petitioner until he or she has  
5 satisfied any other applicable requirements of state or federal  
6 law, and shall not issue a restricted license to the petitioner if  
7 the order granting eligibility for restricted driving privileges  
8 does not comply with subsection (5).

9 (8) If a court determines that a petitioner is eligible for  
10 restricted driving privileges, the court shall notify the  
11 department of its determination through the issuance of an order  
12 under subsection (5) and shall not retain jurisdiction over a  
13 license issued under this section.

14 Sec. 328. (1) The owner of a motor vehicle who operates or  
15 permits the operation of the motor vehicle upon the highways of  
16 this state or the operator of the motor vehicle shall produce,  
17 under subsection (2), upon the request of a police officer,  
18 evidence that the motor vehicle is insured under ~~chapter 31-A~~  
19 **POLICY OF INSURANCE THAT COMPLIES WITH SECTION 3009** of the  
20 insurance code of 1956, 1956 PA 218, MCL ~~500.3101 to 500.3179.~~  
21 **500.3009**. Subject to section 907(15), an owner or operator of a  
22 motor vehicle who fails to produce evidence of insurance upon  
23 request under this subsection or who fails to have motor vehicle  
24 insurance for the vehicle ~~as required under chapter 31-THAT~~  
25 **COMPLIES WITH SECTION 3009** of the insurance code of 1956, 1956 PA  
26 218, MCL ~~500.3101 to 500.3179,~~ **500.3009**, is responsible for a civil  
27 infraction. If a person displays an electronic copy of his or her

1 certificate of insurance using an electronic device, the police  
2 officer shall only view the electronic copy of the certificate of  
3 insurance and shall not manipulate the electronic device to view  
4 any other information on the electronic device. A person who  
5 displays an electronic copy of his or her certificate of insurance  
6 using an electronic device as provided in this subsection shall not  
7 be presumed to have consented to a search of the electronic device.  
8 A police officer may require the person to electronically forward  
9 the electronic copy of the certificate of insurance to a specified  
10 location provided by the police officer. The police officer may  
11 then view the electronic copy of the certificate of insurance in a  
12 setting in which it is safe for the officer to verify that the  
13 information contained in the electronic copy of the certificate of  
14 insurance is valid and accurate. This state, a law enforcement  
15 agency, or an employee of this state or a law enforcement agency is  
16 not liable for damage to or loss of an electronic device that  
17 occurs as a result of a police officer's viewing an electronic copy  
18 of a certificate of insurance in the manner provided in this  
19 section, regardless of whether the police officer or the owner or  
20 operator of the vehicle was in possession of the electronic device  
21 at the time the damage or loss occurred.

22 (2) A certificate of insurance, in paper or electronic form  
23 and issued by an insurance company, that certifies that ~~the~~  
24 ~~security that meets the requirements of sections 3101 and 3102~~  
25 **INSURANCE THAT COMPLIES WITH SECTION 3009** of the insurance code of  
26 1956, 1956 PA 218, MCL ~~500.3101 and 500.3102~~, **500.3009**, is in force  
27 is prima facie evidence that insurance is in force for the motor

1 vehicle described in the certificate of insurance until the  
2 expiration date shown on the certificate. The certificate, in  
3 addition to describing the motor vehicles for which insurance is in  
4 effect, must, if applicable, state the name of each person named on  
5 the policy, policy declaration, or a declaration certificate whose  
6 operation of the vehicle would cause the liability coverage of that  
7 insurance to become void.

8 (3) If, before the appearance date on a citation issued under  
9 subsection (1), the defendant submits proof to the court that the  
10 motor vehicle had insurance ~~meeting the requirements of sections~~  
11 ~~3101 and 3102~~ **THAT COMPLIED WITH SECTION 3009** of the insurance code  
12 of 1956, 1956 PA 218, MCL ~~500.3101 and 500.3102~~, **500.3009** at the  
13 time the violation of subsection (1) occurred, all of the following  
14 apply:

15 (a) The court shall not assess a fine or costs.

16 (b) The court shall not forward an abstract of the court  
17 record to the secretary of state.

18 (c) The court may assess a fee of not more than \$25.00, which  
19 shall be paid to the court funding unit.

20 (4) If an owner or operator of a motor vehicle is determined  
21 to be responsible for a violation of subsection (1), the court in  
22 which the civil infraction determination is entered may require the  
23 person to surrender his or her operator's or chauffeur's license  
24 unless proof that the vehicle has insurance ~~meeting the~~  
25 ~~requirements of sections 3101 and 3102~~ **THAT COMPLIES WITH SECTION**  
26 **3009** of the insurance code of 1956, 1956 PA 218, MCL ~~500.3101 and~~  
27 ~~500.3102~~, **500.3009**, is submitted to the court. If the court



1 requires the license to be surrendered, the court shall order the  
2 secretary of state to suspend the person's license. The court shall  
3 immediately destroy the license and shall forward an abstract of  
4 the court record to the secretary of state as required by section  
5 732. Upon receipt of the abstract, the secretary of state shall  
6 suspend the person's license beginning with the date on which the  
7 person is determined to be responsible for the civil infraction for  
8 a period of 30 days or until proof of insurance ~~meeting the~~  
9 ~~requirements of sections 3101 and 3102~~ **THAT COMPLIES WITH SECTION**  
10 **3009** of the insurance code of 1956, 1956 PA 218, MCL ~~500.3101 and~~  
11 ~~500.3102,~~ **500.3009**, is submitted to the secretary of state,  
12 whichever occurs later. A person who submits proof of insurance to  
13 the secretary of state under this subsection shall pay a service  
14 fee of \$25.00 to the secretary of state. The person shall not be  
15 required to be examined under section 320c and shall not be  
16 required to pay a replacement license fee.

17 (5) If an owner or operator of a motor vehicle is determined  
18 to be responsible for a violation of subsection (1), the court in  
19 which the civil infraction determination is entered shall notify  
20 the secretary of state of the vehicle registration number and the  
21 year and make of the motor vehicle being operated at the time of  
22 the violation. A notification under this subsection shall be made  
23 on the abstract or on a form approved by the supreme court  
24 administrator. Upon receipt, the secretary of state shall

4 secretary of state's main office and the abstracts shall be open  
5 for public inspection during the office's usual business hours.

20 (17) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the

23 outside this state. The secretary of state shall enter on the  
24 master driving record an abstract for a conviction as defined in  
25 section 8a(b) that occurred outside this state in connection with
