The House Standing Committee on Regulatory Reform was called to order by the Chair.

Chairman Webber requested attendance be called to establish a quorum of the appointed committee members:

Representative Filler moved to adopt the March 12, 2019, minutes. There being no objection, the motion prevailed by unanimous consent.

2. Amend page 95, line 20, after "Sections" by striking out "7b,".
3. Amend page 95, line 20, after "8a" by striking out the comma.
4. Amend page 95, line 21, after "MCL" by striking out "432.207b,".
5. Amend page 95, line 21, after "432.208a" by striking out the comma.
