MINUTES OF THE COMMITTEE
ON
JUDICIARY

Tuesday, April 9, 2019 9:00 a.m. Room 519 House Office Building

The House Standing Committee on Judiciary was called to order by Chairman Filler.

Members present: Reps. Filler, LaFave, Farrington, Howell, S. Johnson, Rendon, Berman, Wozniak, LaGrand, Guerra, Elder, Bolden.

Members absent/excused: Rep. Yancey.

Representative Farrington moved to adopt the minutes of March 19, 2019. There being no objection, the motion prevailed by unanimous consent.

Representative LaGrand moved to excuse absent members. There being no objection, the motion prevailed by unanimous consent.

Chairman Filler laid the following bill before the committee:

SB 203 (Sen. MacDonald) Medical marihuana; licenses; definition of applicant; modify.

Senator MacDonald and Frank Waters, representing the Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs, testified together in support of the bill.

Chairman Filler laid the committee at ease, the time being 9:06 a.m.

Chairman Filler called the committee back to order, the time being 9:13 a.m.

HB 4136	(Rep. Berman)	Juveniles; criminal procedure; age of juvenile court jurisdiction in juvenile diversion act; modify.
HB 4137	(Rep. Webber)	Criminal procedure; indigent defense; definition of adult in Michigan indigent defense commission act; modify.
HB 4138	(Rep. Rendon)	Juveniles; criminal procedure; age of juvenile jurisdiction in youth rehabilitation services act; modify.
HB 4139	(Rep. LaGrand)	Criminal procedure; sentencing; procedures for sentencing juveniles prosecuted for personal protection order violation; revise code of criminal procedure to revise age limit.
HB 4140	(Rep. Guerra)	Juveniles; other; detention of juveniles in certain circumstances; modify.
HB 4141	(Rep. Neeley)	Juveniles; criminal procedure; specified juvenile violation definition; modify in probate code of 1939.
HB 4142	(Rep. Elder)	Juveniles; criminal procedure; juveniles under age 18 arrested for nonlisted offenses; provide for jurisdiction in the family division of circuit court.
HB 4143	(Rep. Love)	Corrections; alternatives; placement of youth under 18 with adults during confinement, trial, or transport; prohibit.
HB 4144	(Rep. Brann)	Juveniles; juvenile justice services; county juvenile justice services reimbursements; modify.
HB 4145	(Rep. Filler)	Juveniles; criminal procedure; prejudication confinement of juveniles under 18 years of age in jail; preclude.

HB 4146 (Rep. Whiteford) Juveniles; criminal procedure; raise the age fund; provide for.
