MINUTES OF THE COMMITTEE
ON
JUDICIARY

Tuesday, April 23, 2019 9:00 a.m. Room 519 House Office Building

The House Standing Committee on Judiciary was called to order by Chairman Filler.

Members present: Reps. Filler, LaFave, Farrington, Howell, S. Johnson, Rendon, Berman, Wozniak, LaGrand, Guerra, Elder, Yancey, Bolden.

Representative LaFave moved to adopt the minutes of April 16, 2019. There being no objection, the motion prevailed by unanimous consent.

Chairman Filler laid the following bills before the committee:

HB 4031 (Rep. Brann) Criminal procedure; probation; supervision fees in the code of criminal procedure; modify.

HB 4032 (Rep. Brann) Criminal procedure; other; supervision fees for probation and parole in code of corrections; modify.

The following people submitted a card in support of the bills, but did not wish to speak:

HB 4327	(Rep. Vaupel)	Crimes; assaultive; crime of assaulting a person performing

HB 4328 (Rep. Vaupel) Criminal procedure; sentencing guidelines; sentencing guidelines for crime of assaulting or battering or endangering a health care professional or medical volunteer; provide for.

Representative Vaupel testified in support of the bills. Questions and discussion followed.

Adam Carlson, representing the Michigan Health and Hospital Association, testified in support of the bills. Questions and discussion followed.

Rami Khoury, representing the Michigan College of Emergency Physicians, testified in support of the bills. Questions and discussion followed.

Sean Gehle and Autumn Gillard, representing Trinity Health, and Lisa Glass, representing St. Mary's Mercy Grand Rapids, testified together in support of the bills.

Chairman Filler laid the following bills before the committee:

HB 4374 (Rep. Alexander) Crimes; other; preventing reporting of crime; prohibit by use of position of authority.

HB 4378 (Rep. Pagan) Civil rights; public records; identity of parties proceeding anonymously in civil actions alleging sexual misconduct; exempt from disclosure under freedom of information act.

HB 4379 (Rep. Rabhi) Education; discipline; certain actions regarding pupil who

reports being sexually assaulted; require, and prohibit pupil from being expelled for reported incident.

HB 4383 (Rep. Cambensy) Crimes; other; preventing reporting of certain alleged crimes to title IX coordinator by use of position of authority; prohibit.

Representative Alexander, Representative Pagan, Representative Rabhi, and Representative Cambensy testified in support of the bills. Questions and discussion followed.

Jennifer Smith, representing the Michigan Association of School Boards, testified in support of HB 4378 and in opposition to HB 4379.

The following people submitted a card in support of the bills, but did not wish to speak:
